HICSS-43 will consist of symposia, workshops, tutorials, advanced seminars, a keynote address, a distinguished lecture, formal paper presentations, and ad hoc meetings over four days, January 5-8, 2010, at the Grand Hyatt Kauai Resort & Spa.

Since 1967 HICSS conferences have provided an exciting forum for the exchange of ideas, research results, development activities, and applications among academicians and practitioners in the information, computer, and system sciences. Conference leaders seek the most recent and relevant cross-disciplinary research, providing a variety of research topics and wide-ranging discussion opportunities.

Papers may be theoretical, conceptual, tutorial, or descriptive in nature. Acceptance is based on a strict peer review in a double-blind process, June - August of each year. Accepted papers are published in the HICSS-43 Conference Proceedings, distributed by the IEEE Computer Society Press, and included in Explore, the IEEE Digital Library (<http://computer.org/cspress>).

HICSS papers emphasize advances in research and development activities in several areas of the system sciences (see Tracks). Best Papers Awards are presented in a special presentation on the last day of the conference, after a careful review by a special committee in each track.

Conference attendees enjoy a high degree of personal interaction and lively discussion. Paper presentations and other sessions occur in an informal workshop-like setting. Registrants are expected to attend all four days of the conference – this year Tuesday through Friday – to receive the most professional benefit.

Note: HICSS is funded only by its registration fees. Each attendee or their sponsoring organizations must assume the full cost of participation. Hotel rates are heavily discounted from normal seasonal rates.

How to Submit a Paper Follow Author Instructions found on <http://www.hicss.hawaii.edu>

- HICSS papers must contain original material, and not be previously published, nor currently submitted elsewhere.
- Abstracts are optional. You may contact the Minitrack Chair(s) for guidance or verification of content. If you are not sure of the appropriate Minitrack, submit an abstract to the Track Chair(s) for determination.
- You may submit a paper to only one Minitrack. Duplicate submissions may be rejected by either minitrack without consultation with author.
- An individual may be listed as author/co-author on no more than 6 submitted papers. Track Chairs must approve any names added after submission.

Important Deadlines

June 15 Submission of full manuscripts for review. The review is double-blind; therefore this submission must be without author names.

Aug 15 Acceptance notices are emailed to authors by the Review System. (Make sure your server accepts.) At least one author of each accepted paper must immediately make plans to attend the conference, including initiating fiscal, visa, or other travel guarantees.

Sept 15 Accepted authors submit Final Paper. At least one author of each paper must register by this date. This is the Early Registration fee deadline.

Oct 15 Papers without at least one registered author will be deleted from the Proceedings; authors will be so notified by the Conference Office.

Cancellation and Refund Policy

\$150 will be charged for cancellation of any registration after **Oct 15**. Papers may be deleted from the Proceedings. All cancellations must be in writing.

No refund of registration fee after **Dec 15**.
